**Prismacolor Premier Colored Pencil** – In landscapes color choices do not have to be exact. An array of colors is created as they mix during layering. There is however some colors that I use to create "sparkle" which are applied at the end that cannot be achieved in the layering process. They are starred and are optional, but if you can obtain them I would recommend them. This is a list of my colors, but is not absolute or limited to:

915 Lemon Yellow – light clean yellow 933 True Blue – versatile middle blue 938 white – for blending layers 942 Yellow Ochre – middle value 901 Indigo Blue – dark value blue \*1007 Imperial Violet muted yellow 908 Dark Green – useful to mix with \*1005 Lime peel – light olive green 914 Cream – for blending layers Tuscan and Indigo to create near \*1079 Blue Violet Lake – blue violet 930 Magenta - cool red \*1018 Pink Rose black 921 Pale Vermillion – orange red 996 Black Grape – great for dark

937 Tuscan Red – dark value red

1077 Colorless Blender Pencil by Prismacolor Premier

1 Col-Erase Pencil of either: 20054 Tuscan, 20043 Brown, or 20060 Indigo (this pencil is used to draw in tree limbs. These pencils are erasable to allow for corrections before applying waxed pencil over line and will not smear like graphite pencil) Small tipped stylist: used to indent surface to create tree trunks and grass. A small knitting needle works well.
